We would love to have you join us and learn....“Back to Seascape Basics“.

Day one you will complete a 9 “ x 12 “ canvas. This is a fun day full of great information and you go home with a beautiful painting.

There will be a review of the Basics of Seascape Painting. You will learn about premixing colors and how to mix paint, proper brush maintenance, safe use of solvents, and the use of medium. We will not use any solvents in our class.

There will be an introduction to color, color harmony and the importance of maintaining “Temperature” in your paintings.

You will practice the brush strokes to create motion in your water.

At the end of day one everyone is well prepared to paint the mini master piece that you will do on days two and three.

Day two, you will mix a new palette of colors, lay out your painting, and have the whole canvas covered. This is your under painting. With a soft fan brush you will soften everything so that your painting is ready for all the details and high lights that you will do on day three.

Day three is all the finishing touches that really make a painting beautiful and that is always so difficult to achieve in a workshop.

You will take home a completely finished, gorgeous painting that you can be proud to hang.

This will be a wonderful learning experience and will help you take a big step toward creating your own Seascapes. I look forward to painting with you.
